Earlier this month, Foster told Bay County sheriff's investigators a Springfield police officer raped her. Investigators determined that Foster and Sgt. Mark Fogarty both lied to them

During an interview with The News Herald last week. Foster admitted to selling sex for drugs in the past.

Inese conflicting statements would make it impossible to move forward with a rape charge, Stanford said.

At one time, Foster had been charged with aggravated manslaughter of a child in the Sept. 29, 2002, death of her 3-month-old son, David Nathaniel Jones. She was accused of being in a druginduced sleep when the baby's breathing and heart-rate monitor sounded for more than an hour. The baby died from unknown causes.

The charges were dropped in April of this year.

Her past and her conflicting statements should be overlooked. Foster said.

"It doesn't matter; I was still raped," she said. "It's not right at all. I've not been on no dope. I'm trying to be a good person and trying to get a job.
